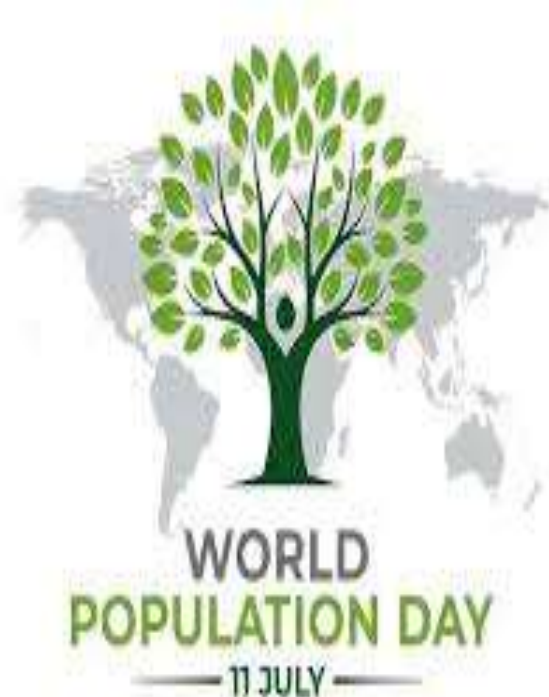

This is in continuation of MNRE's O.M. No. 283/63/2025-GRID SOLAR dated 25th May 2026 regarding the Approved List of Models and Manufacturers (ALMM) - No Blanket extension of ALMM List-II beyond 01.06.2026 subject to Protection of Investments already made.

2. The MNRE has received several representations requesting for issuance of simplified procedure/framework, for claiming exemption from applicability of ALMM List-II (for solar PV cells), under Category-I (Solar PV modules installed on the project site, but the project was not commissioned before 1st June 2026) of MNRE's O.M. No. 283/63/2025-GRID SOLAR dated 25th May 2026, in respect of such **rooftop solar PV power projects that have been installed before 1st June 2026, but could not get commissioned by the concerned DISCOM under Net-Metering framework before 1st June 2026 due to any valid reason(s).**

3. The above representations received in the MNRE have been examined, and the following has been decided:

- a) For those rooftop solar PV power projects that have been installed before 1st June 2026, but could not get commissioned by the concerned DISCOM under the Net-Metering framework before 1st June 2026 due to any valid reason(s), and are claiming exemption from ALMM List-II as mentioned above, may apply for claiming exemption from ALMM List-II through the portal <https://solardcrportal.nise.res.in/> and use supporting information/ documentary proofs, as listed in the table below:

Criteria	Document to be submitted in support of meeting the criteria
Before 01.06.2026, 100% of the solar PV modules required for the project have been installed on the project site.	GIS tagged Site photographs and documentary evidence, such as invoices, daily installation reports, and self-certification.

- b) In the interim period, between the application being made on the portal for claiming exemption from ALMM List-II and the final decision by the competent authority, in respect of such application, the concerned DISCOM may verify such rooftop solar PV power projects based on supporting information/documentary proofs provided by such developers, as listed in table above and allow commissioning of such rooftop solar PV power projects with solar PV modules from ALMM List-I, subject to final outcome of the aforesaid application made on the portal.
- c) However, this window will be available only for one month from the date of issuance of this clarification, within which all such projects are to be commissioned, and in case any project is delayed due to issues with the concerned DISCOM, the same shall be recorded in writing while issuing the commissioning certificate.
- d) No cases shall be entertained after expiry of the above period under this dispensation. The concerned DISCOM shall be solely responsible for verification and certification of eligibility for exemption from ALMM List-II (for solar PV cells) as detailed in para 3(a & b) above. The DISCOM shall maintain a record of verification for such cases, clearly indicating the date of installation completion; reason(s) for delay in commissioning; confirmation of compliance with eligibility conditions, etc.
- e) This relaxation is issued strictly to address a limited transitional situation. It shall not be interpreted as an extension of the Effective Date of 1st June 2026, for the applicability of ALMM List-II (for solar PV cells) for commissioning of Net-Metering/ Open Access, Renewable Power Projects. All other provisions of MNRE's O.M. No. 283/63/2025-GRID SOLAR dated 25th May 2026 shall remain unchanged.

4. This issues with the approval of Secretary, MNRE.

Subject: Commencement of Hearing of Cases before the Goods and Services Tax Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT) State Bench, Bhopal – Reg.

1. It is hereby notified for the information to all the stakeholders, including taxpayers, departmental authorities, authorised representatives and other concerned persons that the State Bench, Bhopal of the Goods and Services Tax Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT) shall commence hearing of cases with effect from 25.06.2026 at its premises situated at First Floor, Satpura Bhawan, Arera Hills, Bhopal (M.P.).

2. The schedule for hearing of cases shall be as follows:

In terms of Office Order No. 3/GSTAT/PB/2026 dated 14.05.2026, issued by the Hon'ble President, GSTAT, Principal Bench, New Delhi (copy enclosed), cases before this Bench shall be listed for hearing as under:

- a. Category-I Cases – Every Thursday of the working week before Court No.1
 - b. Category-II Cases – Every Friday of the working week before Court No.2
 - c. Category-III Cases – As per the nature of the issues involved and as directed by the Bench on the aforesaid days before either Court No.1 or Court No.2.
3. Initially all the Cases will be listed before the Division Bench including cases wherein amount involved is upto Rs. 50 lakhs in-order to decide whether or not any question of law exists. Where no question of law is involved in such appeals, then the matter will be placed before the Hon'ble Vice President for further bench allocation.
4. Hearings shall be conducted in physical mode, virtual mode, or hybrid mode, depending upon the directions of the Bench or on requests made by the parties, subject to approval by the Hon'ble Bench.
5. The daily cause list of matters listed before the Bench shall be published on the GSTAT e-Filing Portal (<https://efiling.gstat.gov.in>) under the "Cause List" tab. Stakeholders

$$\text{Monthly FPPAS for } n^{\text{th}} \text{ Month (\%)} = \frac{(A-B)+C}{\{Z \cdot (1 - \frac{\text{Distribution losses in \%}}{100})\} \cdot \text{ABR}} \cdot 100$$

Where,

- “**Nth**” - Month means the month in which billing of fuel and power purchase adjustment surcharge component is done. This fuel and power purchase adjustment surcharge is due to changes in tariff for the power supplied in (n – 2)th month;
- “**A**” - Total units procured from all sources (n – 2)th Month (in kWh) including Long-term, Medium-term and Short-term Power purchases (To be taken from the bills issued to Distribution Licensee);
